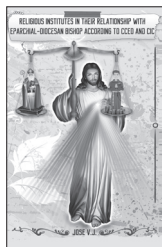
ORIGIN OF CHRISTIANITY IN ANCIENT INDIA: by Jose, VJ

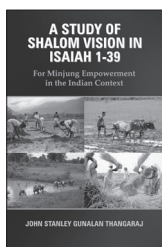

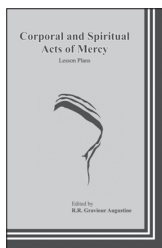

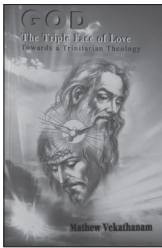


CORPORAL AND SPIRITUAL ACTS OF MERCY – Lesson Plans: by R.R. Graviour Augustine

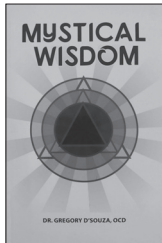


HANDBOOK OF THEOLOGICAL EDUCATION IN WORLD CHRISTIANITY: by Dietrich Werner

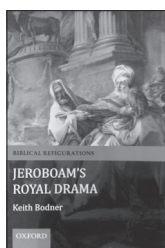


STRENGTH OF THE WEAK - Socio-Political Reflections on the Book of Revelation: by Bishop Antony Samy Peter Abir

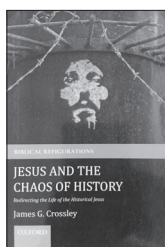


JEROBOAM'S ROYAL DRAMA (Bible Refigurations): by Keith Bodner

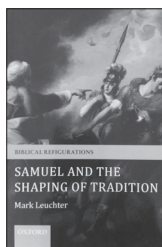


JESUS AND THE CHAOS OF HISTORY – Redirecting the Life of the Historical Jesus (Bible Refigurations): by James G. Crossley
